We are all starting to get settled in our routines, the children going to school are more comfortable with the transportation and building great relationships with our drivers. The children who have either recently started or changed classrooms are also settling in nicely and being supported by the other children and our wonderful staff.

### OUTSIDE TIME & WEATHER

With the weather starting to change I wanted to remind all parents that the Early Years Child Care Act requires all licensed child care centres go outside for at least 2 hours every day, weather permitting.

Weather permitting is defined by the Halton Region Health Department as:

- > Temperature of  $-15^{\circ}\text{C}$  without wind chill
- > Environment Canada has issued an extreme cold warning for outdoor activity (when the temp or wind chill is expected to reach  $-30^{\circ}\text{C}$  for at least 2 hours)
- > Extreme conditions, such as blizzard or ice storm

When the children go outside, teachers continuously monitor the children for signs of being cold. The children will return to the centre early if need be. Please ensure that your child has weather appropriate outdoor gear, including a warm coat, splash pants, hats, light mittens and possibly rain boots. We also request that all children have indoor shoes that remain at the Centre. It is an awful feeling to get here and realize that you do not have any shoes for your child.

**Forgot your child's gloves or need a new pair speak to your child's teacher about purchasing a pair from our on-site stock for \$5.00.**

## ILLNESS

***In an effort to help all the children get into a healthy routine I invite all parents to use the hand sanitizers located at the entrances and to have their children wash hands with soap when entering the classroom in the morning.***

While we know it is stressful and frustrating to receive that dreaded call during the day, you will be notified to pick up your child when signs of illness are present. It is our duty to ensure a healthy environment for all children in our care. For more information, please refer to our Illness Policy. When the number of illnesses increases, the Centre is required by law to report this to the Health Department as they determine our next step. This may include your child being symptom free for 48 hours (versus 24 hours) before returning, increasing our bleach solutions, restricting toys or certain activities. If you have any questions or concerns please feel free to speak with Conny at any time. If you would like to speak with someone at the Health Department you can call 905-825-6000 ext. 7513.

Please note, it is extremely important that all parents inform us when their child is absent from the Centre, especially if they are showing signs of being ill. If your child is away and we haven't heard from you, expect a call finding out why your child is away.

This can be very frustrating; equivalent to you coming home and finding a car in your driveway that is not supposed to be there.
